

Performances:

- Suggested attire is black and white
- Songs are played without written music
- One person is designated as 'group leader' to guide the program at each performance
- Pre-performance time: In respect for those tuning and for the audience, all visiting, tuning and warmup be done in a quiet mode.
- Opening numbers are played by all----'Jamming'.
- Performers may be asked to lead one or two songs
-Inform accompanists of the key in which song is to be played
-Announce the title of the song to the audience
-Lift foot to indicate nearing end of song
- 1st tune----all performers may participate unless the leading performer chooses certain accompanists
- 2nd tune----all performers may participate
- Leads are alternated---fiddle with vocals, etc. for variety.
- Closing numbers are played by all----'Jamming'

A Note On Etiquette

- Musicians are encouraged to lead tunes during practice sessions, to gain experience needed to lead tunes during public performances.
- The lead player determines the speed, rhythm and length of the tune.
- Backup musicians/accompanists show respect and consideration for the lead player by playing to blend with and enhance the leader's performance. If they are not able to hear the lead player they are too loud.
- A unique quality of Old Time Music is that the melody is distinguishable.

Membership in IOTFA
